High School Diploma Requirements

Complete: 230 credits (1 year-long class = 10 credits)

Complete: Subject requirements

Complete: Health requirement

Pass: Integrated Math 1 (or 1 Honors)

(Integrated Math 1 is most often taken in the 9th grade)

(4 recommended)

D. Laboratory Science 2 years

(3 recommended)

E. Language other than English 2 years

(3 recommended)

F. Visual & Performing Art 1 year

G. College Preparatory Elective 1 year

All courses must be completed with a 'C' grade or higher



California Community Colleges

High school graduate or 18 years old
Associate degree, transfer to a 4 year college, vocational
certificates

Fees: \$46 per unit

Transfer Partners with CA Community Colleges

Fees/Tuition: \$6,698



Cal Poly San Luis Obispo

University of California (UC)

Private Colleges & Universities

81 campuses in CA
Admission requirements vary
Some have community college transfer agreements
Fees/Tuition: \$33,109 (based on median)



What you can do NOW to best prepare for high school

- Be **organized** find what works for you
- Complete all classwork/homework assignments
- Communicate with your teachers
- Regularly check teacher websites/Aeries
- Study for tests: it's not enough to say you studied because you did the homework- set time aside to study by reviewing notes, homework, reading.
- Would you like to participate in high school sports?

Maintain C grades or higher to be eligible for Fall sports!
