#### Oak Crest Middle School Activities Contract 2018-2019

This contract must be submitted prior to students attending any school sponsored activities that occur outside of the regular classroom (for example, carnivals, spirit activities, fundraiser celebrations, and dances).

#### I understand the following:

- . Student and his/her parent/guardian must sign the 2018-2019 Oak Crest Middle School (OCMS) Activities Contract prior to attending the school activity/event.
- . Student must be currently enrolled at OCMS in order to attend any school-sponsored activities.
- . Attending any extra-curricular activity through the school is a privilege not a right.
- . School activity tickets may not be transferred to any other student.
- . Tickets are non-refundable.
- . Student must follow all school rules and standards of conduct, including the instructions for properly participating in spirit/fundraising activities, which may include inflatable activity equipment. Administration and staff members will enforce all of the rules and regulations of the San Dieguito Union High School District.
- . Student must be dressed appropriately at all times during the activity.
- . Dancing may not be sexually explicit or inappropriate. For example, no back to front dancing (i.e. freaking, grinding) and/or any dancing which may result in disruption or injury (i.e. slamming, moshing). Offenders will immediately be referred to an administrator for disciplinary action. Any additional infractions will result in progressive discipline which may include being required to leave the dance.
- . Student may be prohibited from attending school activities as a result of misbehavior during school hours or school-sponsored activities.
- . No student will be admitted 30 minutes or more after the activity start time (for example, if the activity begins at 6:00 p.m., no student will be admitted after 6:30 p.m.).
- . Once a student has entered an activity, he/she will not be permitted to leave and enter again.
- . Student may not leave the activity early unless their parent/guardian signs their student out through administration or parent/guardian makes other arrangements in advance with administration.
- . Student(s) must be picked-up in the OCMS parking lot at the advertised ending time of the activity.
- . If student is no longer able to attend the activity, parent/guardian will contact the staff member coordinating the activity or administration in advance.

#### OAK CREST MIDDLE SCHOOL 2018-2019 Behavior Code

The following is a list of unacceptable behaviors and possible consequences. This list is not all-inclusive and is meant as a general guide for disciplinary action. Each behavior incident is considered individually and consequences are assigned according to the particular circumstances of the situation.

#### **RESPECTFUL BEHAVIOR and MINOR OFFENSES**

- 1. **Respect:** Students will treat peers and all school staff with respect.
- 2. Tardies: Students will arrive to class on time and be prepared to work.
- **3. Lunch time:** Students will eat lunch in designated areas and not cut in lunch lines, litter, throw food, or engage in horseplay.
- **4. Academic honesty:** Students will adhere to the Academic Honesty Policy. Students will do their own work. Copying another student's work is considered a violation of the Academic Honesty Policy and may result in loss of credit on the assignment/test.
- **5. Forged notes:** Students will not forge notes or signatures.
- 6. Dress code: Students will adhere to the Dress Code Policy. Per SHUHSD policy (5132), students' clothing must not present a health or safety hazard or a distraction which would interfere with the educational process. Shoes much be worn at all times. Clothing and jewelry shall be free of writing, pictures or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane or sexually suggestive or which advocate racial, ethnic or religious prejudice or the use of drugs and alcohol. Hats, caps and other head covering shall not be worn indoors. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times. Loaner clothes may be issued.
- 7. Gum: Students will not chew gum on campus.
- 8. Selling items: Students will not sell anything to others while at school or on the bus.
- **9. Truancy:** Students will not leave class during the period without teacher permission. Students will not be absent from any class period without a valid excuse obtained through attendance, administration, nurse counseling, or the teacher or they will be considered truant.
- **10. Closed campus:** Students may not leave campus during school day without being checked through Attendance. Guests are not allowed on campus without permission from admin.
- **11. Bikes and skateboards:** Students will not ride bicycles or skateboard on school property. Helmets are required. \*OCMS is not responsible for lost or stolen items at school.
- **12. Bus:** Students will behave appropriately on the bus. \*The SDUHSD Transportation Department Student Code of Conduct will be enforced.
- **13. Computer use:** Students are expected to follow the SDUHSD Acceptable Use Policy.
- 14. Gambling: Students will not gamble.
- 15. Cell phones and other electronic devices: Students are expected to respect each teacher's expectations and rules related to use of cell phones/electronic devices. Students may responsibly use their cell phone/electronic device before and after school, and during passing periods, break and lunch; students must have one earbud/earphone out and be able to hear and respond to another individual if necessary. Students may not use their cell phone or other electronic device to take photos or videos unless they have approval from a staff member. Students may not use their cell phone/electronic device in the restrooms or locker rooms at any time for any purpose; therefore, they should never be out in these locations. All other school rules apply: if a student engages in inappropriate, disruptive, and/or disrespectful behavior related to use of cell phone or electronic devices (including accessing music, images, content, etc. that violate school rules), consequences will be assigned (progressive discipline based on infraction). OCMS not responsible for lost or stolen items at school.

#### **SERIOUS OFFENSES**

- 1. Fighting: Students will not cause, attempt to cause, or threaten physical injury to others.
- 2. Disruption of school activities and defiance: Students will not disrupt school activities or otherwise willfully defy the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties.
- **3. Bullying:** Students will not bully, harass, intimidate, or threaten students or staff. Students are subject to consequences regardless of their intentions.
- **4. Inappropriate behavior:** Students will not commit obscene acts, engage in profanity, vulgarity, or public displays of affection.
- **5. Sexual harassment:** Students will not engage in acts of sexual harassment/assault.
- **6. Tobacco & related products:** Students will not possess, use, furnish, sell tobacco, or any products containing tobacco or nicotine, lighter, matches, or rolling papers, vapes, carts, etc. at school or school events
- 7. Drug paraphernalia: Students will not possess, use, furnish, or sell drug paraphernalia at school/school events.
- **8. Controlled substances:** Students will not possess, distribute, sell, use, or be under the influence of any controlled substance at school or school events.
- **9. School/personal property:** Students will not steal, deface, or vandalize school or personal property. Students will not knowingly receive stolen school or private property.
- **10. Weapons:** Students will not possess, brandish, furnish, or use any weapon, or anything that could be considered a weapon.
- **11. Incendiary device:** Students will not possess, sell, furnish, or use any explosive/devices.
